HYPOCRISY?

Several recent articles in The Telegraph featuring the BBC accuse the corporation of bias, misrepresentation or 'wokery' that is inconsistent With its Charter requirements.

The Telegraph is a signatory of the Independent Press Standards Organisation, but seems to have no qualms about transgressing its own code of practice.

CODE: *The Press must take care not to publish inaccurate, misleading or distorted information or images, including headlines not supported by the text.*

The Telegraph is consistently misleading in its inaccurate use of 'Net Zero' in headlines for articles that are in no way connected to Net Zero: *'Drivers pay hundreds as net zero parking charges spread nationwide'*. In this distortion, the charges are for air pollution, not Net Zero.

The Telegraph headline *'Net zero power station next to our home is so loud we can't even go for a walk'* misrepresents the quote used in the article which was about the past construction phase of a substation, not its current operation.

The Telegraph headline *'The great electric car lie is a monstrous deception against the British public'* appears to have no relationship with the article below it, which is a reasoned and sensible discussion of how Evs are too expensive and have too short a range. Deception? Lie? Where?
